The Immaculate Conception

Twenty-Ninth Sunday of the Year 19th October 2014

Dear friends,

we Christians have a dual nationality. We have a passport, issued by the state of which we are citizen, and we are heirs to the Kingdom of God. Both for the Earthly and the heavenly we have rights and responsibilities but we must ensure that civil obedience never trumps the power and the glory of God. The coin that Jesus asked to see in today's gospel would have had an image of the Emperor Tiberius and would have carried the inscription: "*Tiberius Caesar Augustus, son of the Divine Augustus.*" By saying "*give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God*" our Lord is making a clear distinction between God and the Emperor and is denouncing the idolatrous phrasing on the coin. Note also that Jesus asks to see the coin: he does not have any Roman currency on his own person. Jesus is empty handed as he preaches about the Kingdom of God. Pope Francis is setting us all an example by his own modest life style and calling us to give to God generous hearts and minds. As heirs to his Kingdom whilst we shall make our journey of faith on Earth we are called to work tirelessly for the common good.
